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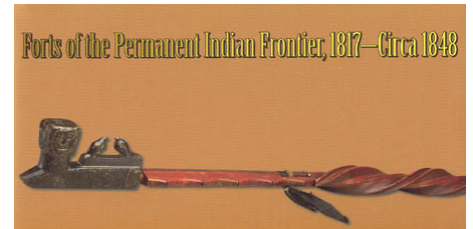

Colorful New Map Features Frontier Forts

Forts of the Permanent Indian Frontier is the first map to give a clear and graphic picture of the line of forts set up in the early 1800s to enforce a Permanent Indian Frontier.



Two hundred years ago the United States decided to create a boundary between European settlers and the indigenous people of North America. From Minnesota to Louisiana, the U.S. Army built and manned forts in what to them was a wilderness. *Forts of the Permanent Indian Frontier* shows that loose chain of forts, many now preserved as popular national, state, and municipal parks.

The map includes a contemporary side, with color photographs showing the parks you can visit today to re-live this part of American history. A historical side describes the old forts and their location as well as showing the rich cultures of the indigenous people who lived in the plains.
