Presentation | *Crater Lake and Beyond: Land of Fire and Ice*

Author Jim Turner has the scoop on Crater Lake! Hear “gee whiz” facts about Crater Lake, Oregon Caves, Lassen Volcanic National Park, Mount Shasta, Lava Beds National Monument, Klamath Falls Wildlife Refuge, and Newberry Volcanic National Monument. In his book *Crater Lake and Beyond: Land of Fire and Ice*, Turner describes the creation of the volcanos; various types of lava; the prehistoric, American Indian, and Anglo-European history of the area; and the creation of Crater Lake. The talk will also offer details about the rivers, plants, and animals in the area. Although some environmental issues are addressed, this talk will primarily feature facts about Crater Lake and the origin stories of some of the area’s most “must-see” items.
